La aree linguistice SLOVENE dal Friûl e cjape dentri 27 comuns (e si slargje in altris 5 in provincie di Triest). In total (Friûl plus Triest) si stimin plui o mancul 50.000 locutôrs. Cheste minorance, menaçade dal Fassism, e à otignût intal secont dopovuere altis formis di tutele juridiche.

The SLOVENIAN language area of Friûl includes 27 municipalities (and another 5 in the Province of Trieste/Trst). In total (Friûl and Trieste/Trst) there are around 50,000 speakers. In the aftermath of WWII, this minority, threatened by fascism, was granted several instruments of legal protection.

La aree di LENGHE TODESCJE dal Friûl storico non je continue: e cjape dentri trê "penisulis" - la Val Cjanâl, Tamau e Sapade (in teritori amministrati veniti), che a confinî cu la Austria - e une isule, Sauris, par un total di plui o mancul 5.000 locutôrs. Chestis comunitàs a son stadiis ricognossudis in maniere ufficial dal Stât dome intal 1999.

The GERMAN-SPEAKING section of the historical Friûl region is scattered in the area: it includes three "peninsulas" - the Kanaltal/Kanalska dolina/Val Cjanâl/Val Canale, Tischlbong/Tamau/Timau and Ploden/Sapade/Sappada (in Veneto administrative territory) areas, bordering on Austria - and an island, Zahre/Sauris, with a total of 5,000 speakers. These communities were officially recognized by the State in 1999.



La Val Cjanâl - che e cjape dentri i comuns di Pontebé, Malborghet e Valbrune e Tarvis - e je CUADRILENGÂL: achi si fevele todesc, sloven, furlan, talian. Chestis lenghis a son ricognossudis in maniere ufficial dal Stât talian. La Region Friûl-Vignesie Julie e à une leç regional par ognidune des sôs trê minorancis.

In Kanaltal - that includes the towns of Pontafel/Pontebé/Tablja/Pontebla, Malborghet-Wolfsbach/Naborjet-Ovcja vas/Malborghet e Valbrune/Malborghetto-Valbruna and Tarvis/Tarvisio - FOUR LANGUAGES are spoken: German, Slovenian, Friulian, Italian. These languages are officially recognized by the Italian State. Friuli-Venezia Giulia has a regional law protecting each of its three minorities.

Di un pont di viste linguistic, il Friûl al è un vêr mosaic. Dome il Friûl al pues svantâ, in Europe, une convivence, di secui incà e ancjemò vive, dai trê çocs linguistics dal Vecjo Continent: latin (furlan e talian), gjermanic (todesc e comunitàs gjermanofonis) e slâf (sloven).

From a linguistic point of view, Friûl is a genuine mosaic. Friûl is the only European area where the three different language stocks of the Old Continent have coexisted, and still are: Latin (Friulian and Italian), Germanic (German and German-speaking communities) and Slavic (Slovenian).
